- A. Paul Seversky, Enrollment Projection Study
 - Webex presentation on the enrollment study for the Beaver River CSD.
- B. Amy Baker, Summer Program Presentation

- Amy presented about the STEM Summer program. It was a 3 week program for 12 students grades 6-7. The students had a different them each week with a major challenge. Week 1 was a safety, aerodynamics & wind blade based activity and the students made "air racer car"s, they build their cars and raced each other at the end of the week. Week 2 was a materials, buoyancy and robot boats based activity and the students made sphero boats and were able to float them in a kiddie pool. Week 3 was construction, measurement and drones. The students were so excited to be able to build obstacles and fly the drones. The constructed the obstacles and flew the drones in the hallways, in the gymnasium and also outside. This was an amazing program for students.

C. Dr. Kimberly Lyman-Wright, Elementary Principal

-Dr. Lyman Wright presented about total enrollment for the PK-5 first day of school by grade level. With the presentation regarding the enrollment study,this gave us an idea of where our enrollment numbers are from the year 2020 to current 2023. This year the two smallest cohorts for enrollment are the Kindergarten with 50 students and 5th grade with 55 students. 5th grade has been small since they have entered Kindergarten. The largest cohort is 1st grade with 75 total students. Enrollment numbers have remained the same from the 2022-2023 school year to this current school year.

D. Troy Hebert, Middle/High School Assistant Principal

- Mr. Hebert presented the enrollment numbers for the MS/HS students. Comparative enrollment data was given from the 2019-2020 school year to present. The total number for September enrollment for the High School was 258 students which dropped just a little from last year, but the comparison over the last 5 years has remained steady. The Middle School enrollment for September was 201 students, which we gained a few students consistently over the last few years. Each grade from 7-12 have about the same amount of students which average around 60 students per grade.

E. Daniel Rains, Middle/High School Principal

- Mr. Rains presented on the Class of 2024 and the status of those students who will be graduating in June. We have 69 students in the senior class with 68 of those anticipated graduating in June 2024. 1 student has an other track. We have 2 students graduating ahead of their own cohort, 42 seniors attending a BOCES program, 4 seniors taking two courses in the same sequence(ELA or Social Studies) and 2 seniors that need to pass a lower course(Algebra, Global, Earth Science, Living Environment, etc.)
